

Lesson Characteristics of Living and Non-Living Things



What's In

We are surrounded every day with so many things. Things like plants and animals or like rivers and clouds. There are also manmade things like cars and buildings. But how do these things differ from each other?

Things which are alive are called living things. Things which are not alive are called non-living things. But how would you know if a thing is alive or not?

Living things can move, grow, and reproduce. Non-living things, on the other hand, can also move but they cannot reproduce.



Notes to the Teacher

Plants, animals, and human beings are alive and are examples of living things. They consume energy to grow, move on their own and reproduce.


Air, water, rocks, and buildings are not alive although some of them can grow or move with the help of others, but they can never reproduce. They are examples of non-living things.






